For those who, today and in every age, have used their best knowledge of current technology to cast and tune and hang these bells.

We give thanks for the generosity of those who have made the project possible by their gifts of time, money and talents.

As we recall that bells have rung out over Ledbury for centuries, calling people to worship we also recognise that these bells express the joys and sorrows of the whole community, ringing out at times of celebration and times of sadness, both personal and national. So we pray that the sound of these bells may bring comfort to the sad, deepen the joy of those who are happy, encourage the faithful, and announce your welcome to those who seek.

During the last verse of the Hymn, the Bishop, the Rector, the Churchwardens, the Tower Captain and Ledbury ringers move to the front of the nave for the act of dedication.

Dedication ceremony

The Tower Captain hands a bell rope to the Rector, who addresses the Bishop:

The Rector: Bishop Richard, please receive this rope as a symbol of the restored and new bells hanging in the tower, which we ask you to dedicate to the Glory of God.

The Bishop: Let us pray. Almighty God, we offer to you all the work that has been undertaken to restore & augment these bells, and to repair the tower inside and out. We ask for your blessing on all that has been done, and dedicate it to your glory. Sanctify, we pray, the bells, that they may carry the message of your love to the whole of Ledbury. Bless with your grace all those who ring here, so that they and those who hear the bells rung may lift their hearts in praise to Jesus Christ Our Lord.

In the name of God, Father, Son & Holy Spirit.

The Bishop addresses the Ledbury bellringers.

The Bishop: Bellringers of Ledbury, will you dedicate your energy and skills that you may always ring to the glory of God?

The bellingers: With the help of God, we will.

The Bishop invites all other bellringers in the congregation to stand:

The Bishop: Those of you who ring bells in other churches in this district and beyond, will you, too, dedicate your energy and skills that you may always ring to the glory of God? The bellingers: With the help of God, we will.

The Bishop asks the whole congregation to stand.

The Bishop: People of God, will you dedicate yourselves to the glory of God, so that your whole lives ring out to His praise?

With the help of God, we will.

The Bishop invites the congregation to be seated.
